Presidents Report AGM 10th September 2016

Our 40th Birthday Year has been one of many club highs and lows. I would like to personally thank our committee for their hard work and the extra mile they put in following the bushfire closure of our January competition. It was a big ask after such a long year of hard work, to expect them all to give up their Easter plans to re run the Australia Day Competition at Easter in 2016. However they rose to the occasion and turned up to do it all again.

Back in June 2015 the winter long weekend competition attracted 32 competitors. 62 fish were caught over the 2 days, the competition closed early Sunday due to bad weather. It was pleasing to see all members acting responsibly and checking to ensure that all competitors were safely back at the Lodge. We held a members meeting that Sunday night and all headed home earlier on the Monday. Heaviest fish for the competition was caught by Tom Rowlands weighing in at 862 gms and Martin Exel was awarded Most Fish with 21 fish and Best Bag of 6 fish by weight - 3.652 kg

At the September AGM 4 new committee members joined up Troy Stonehouse, Tom Rowlands, Chris Podesta, and the Turtle (Anthony Franklin). This is what the club needs going forward – each year we need new blood coming in. Our older members are expressing the desire to step away but would still like to be involved by helping out behind the scenes where they can. They will always be there to assist at club events. This next few years is the time for more new members to step up and join the committee.

Our annual Charity weekend was held in November. This was a success with Able Australia attending bringing clients from around the state. Camp Quality didn't take up our offer and we are in liaison to see if there is interest from them to attend future November events with us. However Able have expressed interest in joining us for 2 days and camping over with their clients and the committee on Saturday night. I must also make mention of Mick who works on the farm where the club pond is. Mick surprised us by building a jetty at the pond and seats. He has also discussed his plans for a permanent shelter at the pond. The club members have offered to assist by finding some materials to donate.

Throughout 2015 the committee supported by a few members attended community events. Sometimes up to a couple times a month to sell raffle tickets and raise funds to purchase the 2016 tournament prize boat. They also promoted the Lodge, our club and in particular our planned 40th Birthday event in January. This workload I believe has taken its toll on the committee as since Easter 2016 they have all expressed the need for a well-earned rest.

The inaugural STLAA Interclub Challenge was held at Lake Crescent in October many of us attended with the kids while the women and a few northern members held a club stall at the Longford Show. I hear it was quite an effort to pack up the tent in the storm but they did it and continued to raise the profile of the club. In November, members and the committee also attended the Bothwell Bushfest for the second year running raising funds and promoting our club over two days.

December 2015 was the month where we held a working bee to restore the club jetty at Strathgordon. The renovation materials were funded by our club Patron Nigel Heaven and quite a few of our members donated their time to repair the jetty. Thanks to Nigel and all who attended and for those of you who have made it to the Strathgordon this year, I'm sure you agree it's looking great.

January 2016. Well what can I say. This is the competition that went "pear shape" and we have been trying to recover from ever since. The work that went into the competition and the money the club spent has not been recovered and it's going to take us a couple of years to recover. 50 competitors were at Strathgordon in January and the rest were on the "other side" unable to get in to fish with us. There were a lot of communication break downs between the emergency services and we were given conflicting

messages which made it hard to make a decision for the first few days. However no one was injured and the competition was rescheduled for Easter in the end.

The Rescheduled Australia Day Competition at Easter – well what a title but that’s what it became known as. 140 competitors arrived at Easter and 357 fish were caught. A new member from Longford was the lucky winner of the tournament boat major prize. At this competition we trialled our new software designed especially for the club and our competitions – this has been money well spent over the past year and will set the club up for the future with a specially built program the younger generations will easily adapt to using. We are now working on a project to set up the club finances in an accounting program that is easier to manage.

Our 2016 40th Birthday celebrations finished off with the annual club dinner at the Winter at Pedder June competition where our 40th Birthday cake was cut and we celebrated with a flare demonstration for members and tourists staying at the Lodge.

It’s been a year of highs and lows; Congratulations to the Heaviest fish winner for season Leighton Beer who caught a nice fish weighing in at 1274gs at Easter. We ended the year with a total membership of 130 members – our last high for the year was the arrival of 48 new members. Many of our long term members did not attend the Easter competition or renew memberships this year. The club has noticed the significant financial loss of membership and competition entry fees and this will affect us financially over the next couple of years. We have attempted to raise funds by attending the Liaweenee trout weekend in May to sell club merchandise that couldn’t be sold in January and have plans to attend the Bothwell Bushfest in November.

Before I close I’d like to acknowledge the passing of two long time club members Mick Corner and Alan Gourlay. Both were club stalwarts who will be sadly missed by those that had the opportunity to know these two fellows. Our thoughts are with Joyce and Tracey and their families.

Lastly thank you to the committee and members for all the time and work put into the club during the year. It’s the people in our club that make this such a great club to be part of. It has been a pleasure to be your president and I look forward to next year.

Returning committee members are Paul Browne – who is our Charity event coordinator, Tom Rowlands, Dylan Loh, John Groves, David Wright and Anthony Franklin (aka Turtle). My thanks to our retiring committee members; Life member Kim Cooper and members Ian Cooper (aka Tubby), Rosie Cooper and Shane Alderton. 



If travelling from Hobart turn off to the right at the balloons in Ouse into Victoria Valley Road.



Travel about 11 kms Victoria Valley Road - you will leave sealed surface and travel until you see balloons on the right.


