Committee Report

This is an outline of committee activities since the March S/W Bulletin...

A stereo for the children's disco and two trestle tables have been purchased by the club. The stereo has an iPod/iphone docking station and cd player. We are looking for a member to volunteer to bring music up to be played each January for the disco. So if music is your passion we would love to hear from you.

We also plan to purchase a double event tent for the registration desk and Merchandise sales. The one last January was borrowed and the committee has voted to go ahead and purchase a tent that we can keep at the chalet. A double one was decided on for the time when we have a wet competition which is very possible at Pedder. This will also come in handy when we start to hold events at our club pond.

LPAC membership cards were sent out to members earlier this year. You need to keep these cards and know your member number for the weigh in and fisherman's pie draw at club competitions. Show your LPAC card and save at sponsors stores and when booking into the chalet. All the fishing stores that sponsor the club have agreed to provide a member discount. The chalet has kept the accommodation prices the same as last Back to Pedder for January 2013 and if you stay there during the year show your card and you will be given a members rate which is well below the tourist rate. The chalet is also offering the club a cheaper menu in the restaurant during the competition days.

Strategic plan and budget development has been coordinated by Gundars Simsons. This will assist the club with planning for the next 3 - 5 years. A budget has been drafted for the coming financial year. If you have any ideas for the club, the committee would love to hear of them. We plan to use this plan over the coming year to apply for more grants and lobby for sponsorship to improve the facilities at Pedder for our members, the public and tourists.

Thank you certificates have been sent to all sponsors for 2012. Sponsors are currently being confirmed for 2013. The January competition book has been reviewed by John Groves and is being sent to the printers in July. If you are a sponsor or know of a sponsor you wish to approach, we need to know now if these companies are sponsoring us in 2013 for their names to be included in this book. Sharon can forward a sponsor package to you if you wish to approach someone to sponsor our club.

To promote the club and the Back to Pedder Competition, the tournament boat package which is the 2013 major prize draw will be on display outside sponsor's stores from September til early January. We need members to volunteer to stand near the display to answer questions about the club and competition and sell the club raffle tickets during the busier shopping days/months. A major sponsors banner, Back to Pedder posters and competition books will be made in time for the start of this display doing the rounds of our sponsors stores.

Planning is underway to increase the number of club events but at the same time this has to be managed with the workload that the committee is able to manage. Four events are planned for 2013, with a club dinner at the winter competition. A fourth event will be held at the club pond and a date will be announced once the pond is established. Two other events on our calendar bring club members together at angling events - New Norfolk Licensed Anglers opening weekend event on the Derwent River provides the club with the opportunity to fish as a team and The Eddie Wigston Memorial Competition is held in honour of the founder of Wigston lures. The club has sponsored this competition with a cash donation for some years now. Many club members fish this weekend event and we will continue to sponsor this as a club. We hope to see more club members attend this competition held on the third weekend in March each year.

To assist to raise funds we will be selling club merchandise on a tourist price list in the chalet store which is to be set up over the winter. We also plan to hold impromptu raffles and sell sports tickets at club events competitions and club meetings when there are larger gatherings. Leon Cubit makes fish cakes and has fished Pedder since the 80's, Leon has offered the club his fish cakes for the club to sell at club events and raise funds for the club.

To keep club children occupied of an evening and during the bad weather days at Pedder, we have started a toy box with toys donated by members that will be kept at the chalet. If you have any unwanted toys, DVDs, board games etc we would love to have them for this box. Thank you to the members who donated toys and videos at the June competition.

A club information flyer has been developed to advertise the club and our events. Hydro has offered to print this for the club and it will be distributed around the state in coming months.

Back to Pedder book and poster are about to be sent to the printers. John has put a lot of time into editing the book and has placed more information in it on safety and information aimed at people fishing the lake for the first time. Camping site information has also been enhanced. Member's photos have been used throughout the book this year. The book and poster will be placed on our website as soon as it is finalised.

Bi monthly Committee meetings are listed in the events calendar – we are getting good attendances to meetings with up to 20 people joining us for a meal beforehand. All members are welcome to attend. Sharon makes a reservation for a club table on the Monday before a meeting, so if you are planning to eat let Sharon know before this. We book the table from 5.30 pm and have found if we order before 6pm we are all fed by the time the meal starts at 7pm.

Our AGM is planned for 7pm on 8th August at Glenorchy, RSL. A nomination form for committee and exec roles was handed out to members on snail mail present at the competition and has since been emailed to all other members. Other mail members will receive their copy with the newsletter. As per the constitution, the nomination form and/or proxy vote form must be returned 10 days prior to the AGM. *Committee*

Competition Report

All trophies were donated by LPAC and adults were given a LPAC engraved glass donated by Berry's Jewellers and the children were given a club polo top donated by Badgers Makes Badgers.

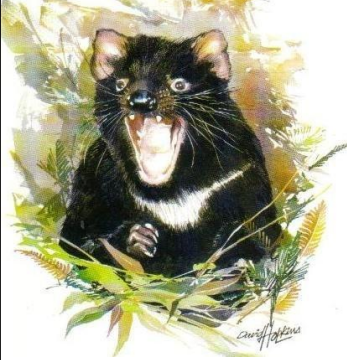

Heaviest trout prizes in the following categories;

- Senior Male and Female
- Junior – 6 to 13yrs Male and Female
- Junior – 14 to 17yrs Male and Female

Cost for the competition is \$10.00 for adults & \$5.00 for juniors.

A Perpetual Shield, THE DERWENT RIVER CHALLENGE SHIELD, will be awarded to the club that weighs the five heaviest combined trout.

4. Fishing may not commence prior to 12:01 am on Saturday 4th August 2012, in line with current IFS regulations.
5. Fish weighed in on Sunday will have their fins clipped. Therefore fish presented with clipped tail fins will not be accepted by the committee. If you need to identify fish please use another method.
6. Fish must be presented to the weigh master cleaned, gilled and unfrozen in a condition that is acceptable to the committee.
7. Anglers must be in line prior to the weigh-in cut off times. Fish will not be accepted after this time.
8. All entrants will be entered in to the Fisherman's Pie Draw. It is not necessary to catch a trout to win prizes from the draw. Once your name is drawn it will not re-enter the prize draw.
9. All prizes will be awarded at the conclusion of Sundays weigh-in.
10. All decisions made by the committee are final.

Whole Trout with Feta and Spinach Stuffing

Cut into this beautiful whole trout to discover the tasty surprise filling inside.

Preparation Time: 20 minutes (+5 mins standing and 5 mins cooling time)

Cooking Time: 15 minutes

Ingredients (serves 4)

- 4 300g scaled, gutted, cleaned trout
- 1 bunch English spinach, washed, dried, stems removed
- 2 tablespoons pine nuts
- 100g Greek feta crumbled
- 70g (1 cup) fresh coarse white breadcrumbs, from day-old bread
- 1 tablespoon fresh thyme leaves
- ½ teaspoon salt
- Cracked black pepper
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- Canola cooking spray to grease

Method:

Remove the trout from the fridge 5 minutes before cooking. Rinse trout inside and out. Pat dry with paper towel. Cut two 1cm deep, 6cm long slashes, 4 cm apart in the thickest part of the flesh on each side.

Wash spinach under cold water, shake and place wetted leaves in a medium saucepan. Cook, covered, over medium heat for 4 -5 minutes or until wilted. Place in a colander and set aside for 5 minutes to cool. Press to remove excess liquid, chop roughly and place in a medium bowl.

Cook pine nuts in a small frying pan, stirring, over medium heat for 2 -3 minutes or until golden. Transfer to a board and chop roughly. Add pine nuts, feta, breadcrumbs, thyme, salt and pepper to spinach and mix well. Pack a quarter of the mixture loosely into each trout cavity. Rub trout all over with oil. Place trout side by side in a well oiled hinged wire frame.

Spray the cold barbeque grill with the cooking spray and then preheat on medium for 5 minutes. Place trout in frame on grill and cook for 4 – 5 minutes each side or until cooked. To check, open frame and part one slash. If there is more than 2 mm of pink flesh close to bone, reclip and cook for a further 1 -2 minutes. To serve use tongs to transfer the trout to serving plates.
